## **The Body and Blood of Christ**

This feast usually makes us think of the Body of Christ in the Eucharist or Communion host, and we often forget that the Blood of Christ is also a part of the Eucharist. Our three readings today help us to think about the part the Blood of Christ plays in our salvation.

The first reading tells us about how the Israelites agreed to accept the covenant with God that Moses had received on Mount Sinai by having half the blood of bulls sprinkled on them, (and the other half upon the altar of God), while they said, “All that the Lord has said, we will heed and do.”

The gospel reminds us that at the Last Supper Jesus took the chalice and said, “This is my blood of the covenant”. In the second reading the author interprets this to say that our new covenant with God is sealed not with the blood of bulls as with Moses, but rather with the very Blood of Jesus that was poured out for us upon the Cross of Calvary,

How blessed we are during the past forty years since the Second Vatican Council that all of us now have the opportunity at every Mass to drink from the chalice as we receive Holy Communion.

For many centuries our church did not allow this. Drink today, and as you do, say to God, “All that you have said, I will heed and do.”

## **El Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo**

Esta fiesta generalmente nos hace pensar en el Cuerpo de Cristo, en la Hostia Eucaristía o Comunión, y casi siempre nos olvidamos que la Sangre de Cristo es parte de la Eucaristía. Nuestras tres lecturas de hoy nos ayudan a entender como la Sangre de Cristo es una parte en nuestra salvación.

La primera lectura nos habla de cómo los israelitas estuvieron de acuerdo para aceptar el pacto con Dios que Moisés había recibido en el monte Sinaí, por tener la mitad de la sangre de los toros rociada sobre ellos ( y la otra mitad sobre el altar de Dios) mientras que ellos dijeron, “ Todo lo que el Señor ha dicho, vamos a prestar atención y hacer.”

El evangelio nos recuerda que en la última cena Jesús tomó el cáliz y dijo: “ Esta es mi sangre de la alianza”. En la segunda lectura el autor dice que nuestra alianza con Dios no está sellada con la sangre de los toros, como estuvo con Moisés, sino con la propia sangre de Jesús, derramada por nosotros en la Cruz del Calvario. ¡Que bendecidos somos nosotros desde el Concilio Vaticano: ahora todos tienen la oportunidad en cada misa de tomar del cáliz. Al tomar hoy, diga: “Haré todo lo que manda el Señor”!
